


Curriculum For Everyone

Curriculum Intent

As part of our vision of pursuing 'success for everyone', we strongly believe in offering a broad, balanced, challenging, and inclusive curriculum, which caters for our students' needs. It supports them in fulfilling their ambitions, whilst also fostering a love of learning, the skills to be successful and an understanding of how they can be healthy, safe, and well-rounded citizens. This successful curriculum approach is underpinned by high expectations, high quality teaching and an emphasis on fostering positive learning behaviours from students.

Our curriculum is a knowledge-rich curriculum, which has been carefully mapped out across all subjects to develop **powerful knowledge** - knowledge which is systematically developed to predict, explain concepts, and enable students to envisage alternatives. This knowledge is not just that prescribed by the national curriculum or by exam boards, but knowledge which allows students to gain a comprehensive understanding of the subject and foster a full appreciation for each discipline and its importance in the world.







Broad

Our curriculum promotes the holistic development of our young people including their social, moral spiritual and cultural understanding and sensitivities.

Balanced

We believe in subject equity. Students understand the value of all subject disciplines and do not prioritise some over others.

Coherent

Our curriculum is sequenced in a way that ensures students deepen their understanding and become better at a subject over time. Subject content is carefully mapped to build long term memory underscored by the principle that if nothing is remembered, nothing has been learned.

Powerful

Some knowledge is more important than others. We select and teach the knowledge that "provides the best understanding of the natural and social worlds that we have and helps us go beyond our individual experiences" (Young, 2014).

Our students are also taught to understand that knowledge is fragile, contested and constantly evolving. They are with us to join in the pursuit of answering life's greatest questions.

Challenging

Our curriculum is aspirational and exposes students to the best of what has been thought and said. Teaching approaches take account of student's prior knowledge and skills, ensuring that true learning takes place.

Inclusive

Our curriculum celebrates diversity and moves beyond a euro-centric world view. Teachers contextualise content, acknowledge the limitations of the field of study and actively prepare our students to advocate equality.



Choosing Rossett for your child's secondary education means choosing a curriculum designed to give them the knowledge they need to succeed in life and develop a lifelong love of learning.



SUPPORT

Support For Everyone

Rossett School is confident that all students will achieve their potential, become confident individuals living fulfilling lives and make a successful transition into employment, further or higher education or training. We recognise that along the way students will require expert additional support.

At Rossett School we are proud of the support we offer to all our students.

Pastoral

Each student at Rossett School benefits from an experienced and dedicated team of pastoral staff. This includes the Form Tutor, who will see your child every day. There is also a Learning Support Officer and Director of Learning assigned to each year group, who are trained to provide further support for students who may have additional needs.



Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND)

Rossett School has a whole school approach to special educational needs and disability. It is a priority that all students, irrespective of need, can access the full national curriculum. All students are the shared responsibility of all staff.

Mental Health and Wellbeing

The Wellbeing in Mind Team is based at Rossett School and is an NHS service that has been introduced as part of the national plans to expand mental health services for children, young people and their families within the educational setting. The Wellbeing in Mind Team aims to positively impact the mental health and wellbeing of young people in our area.





Just 'B' provides emotional wellbeing support to our students, should they need it. This service provides children and young people with a space to share, explore and develop an understanding of their lives and emotional responses. Support is flexible, holistic and integrated with other services, based on the needs of the child or young person.





Opportunity For Everyone

There is a strong programme for students' personal development at Rossett School. Students have a broad, rich set of experiences and opportunities. This range of experience and opportunity is coherently planned for students to develop interest, character, and talent.

At Rossett School our careers programme ensures that all students are fully prepared for future success in education, employment or training.



RESPECT



Respect For Everyone

We believe that regular, consistent routines allow students to form effective learning habits. Our routines are used by all staff, are rooted in our school values and reinforce why this is important to everyone being successful. They are:

Strong start

This includes a 'meet and greet' at the door, where students are warmly welcomed into the classroom, already motivated and ready to learn.

Do now task

This short task, which encourages retrieval of prior knowledge, and completed in silence, establishes the conditions for learning to take place.

STAR

When discursive activities are being used all students sit up, track the speaker, ask and answer questions by raising their hand. In doing so they demonstrate their respect for others.

Silent and solo

Independent work is set so students can concentrate without interruption and so the teacher can circulate, support and give feedback. This also allows students to build their resilience, as we know when learning is hard we often learn the most.

Transitions and attention

When student attention is needed, a clear signal is given by the teacher and followed by all.

Exit routines

The students take responsibility for their environment and for themselves. They check to make sure the classroom is ready for the next group, and they check themselves to make sure they are ready and smart for their next lesson.

Reward and recognition are used consistently across the school to promote and motivate students into effective habits for learning and to celebrate student success.

SAFEGUARDING AND ED



Safeguarding

Rossett School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all of our students. Each student's welfare is of paramount importance.

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility. Everyone who comes into contact with children and their families and carers has a role to play in safeguarding children. In order to fulfil this responsibility effectively, all professionals will make sure their approach is child-centred. This means that they will consider, at all times, what is in the best interests of the child.



Rossett School follows NYSCP multi-agency procedures and Practice Guidance. This has been agreed as a framework for multi-agency working in child protection across North Yorkshire. It reflects the relevant national legislation, current guidance and local context in North Yorkshire. All staff are trained on the most recent Keeping Children Safe in Education, there are also 4 level 3 trained DSLs in school.

Equality, Diversity and Inclusion

Rossett School provides education for all, acknowledging that the society in which we live is enriched by diversity. We strive to recognise and celebrate the diversity within our school community. Everyone is equally valued through our cohesive, inclusive, respectful ethos.

To recognise our work in this area we are working towards the Red Kite Red Award.







Starting At Rossett

Although the move from primary to secondary education can seem daunting, here at Rossett we endeavour to make it as smooth as possible aided by our excellent liaison and transition programme.

Key Rossett staff visit our primary feeder schools to meet with Year 6 students and there is a comprehensive events timeline for students and parents providing vital transitional information.

Transition Events

- Open Day
- Additional visits offered to see the school in action
- Contact made with parents/carers
- Dedicated email for questions available transition@rs.rklt.co.uk
- A varied programme of transition events take place
- Primary school visits by Achievement and Progress Lead and Year 7 Pastoral Lead to meet children and teachers
- Welcome letter sent to students by Director of Learning for Year 7
- Year 6 students spend two days at Rossett experiencing lessons and break times, meeting staff and other students. There will be a variety of activities organised to allow us time to assess their strengths so that we are well prepared to meet their needs in September
- Parents' Evening (for parents only) a chance to meet your child's form tutor.
 Information including our iPad scheme, transport, lunches, PTA and school uniform will also be available during the evening





School Admissions

Applying for a school place for your child may seem a daunting at first, so we want to help support you as best we can. This is a quick guide to our admissions policy and process.

More information is available Here and we are happy to answer any questions you may have, so please contact us should you need to.

Red Kite Learning Trust is the admission authority for all our Trust schools and works in coordination with North Yorkshire Council (NYC) to administer the school application process fairly and effectively.

- The national deadline for Year 7 applications for September 2025 places is 31 October 2024
- To apply, you need to complete the North Yorkshire Council online form, which you can find here: School admissions
- It is important to read the 2025/26 admissions policies for the schools of interest to you. These can be found on each individual school website. Ours can be found Here
- Please ensure you provide any extra information, relevant to support your application, as detailed in the 2025/26 admissions policy for Rossett School
- To see how places were allocated in previous years, you can view the NYC statistics tool here: Check a school's admissions details
- It is recommended to name 5 preferred schools on your application form
- Living in the catchment area does not guarantee a place at the school
- Your child's or a sibling's attendance at any other of our Red Kite Learning Trust primary schools does not give priority for admission to Rossett School
- If you require help with completing your application form, please contact NYC by calling 0300 121 2131 or by submitting a **contact form**
- If you are applying to a school from outside North Yorkshire, you must apply for school places through your own local authority instead of via NYC
- Make sure to inform your local authority of any changes to your circumstances as soon as possible (for example if you are moving house)
- You will be offered a place at your highest preference school, for which your application meets the school's admissions policy priority criteria
- Places will be offered in writing by North Yorkshire Council on Secondary National Offer Day 3 March 2025

How your application is processed

Applications and offers for school places (including in-year applications) are co-ordinated by North Yorkshire Council, in line with the selection criteria set out in the school's admissions policy. Applications for places are ranked in priority order when a school is oversubscribed and receives more applications than there are places available.

For Rossett School, the criteria are as follows:

After the admission of pupils with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) naming the school...

- 1. Looked after children and all previously looked after children
- 2. Children without an EHCP but who have special educational needs, or with exceptional medical, mobility or social needs, which can only be met at the school
- 3. Children who have a parent employed by Red Kite Learning Trust as an established school staff team member within the school at the time of application
- 4. Children living in the Harrogate rural zone and Harrogate town zone (see policy for sibling priority criteria)
- 5. Children living outside the Harrogate rural and Harrogate town zones, living nearest to the school

Supporting The Wider Education Community

Rossett School is committed to train and develop school colleagues at every stage of their careers, from initial teacher training through to a full range of school leadership programmes. Our students benefit from this wider work as it impacts directly on the quality of teaching they receive.



Red Kite Education

Red Kite Education is a team of experienced and talented colleagues who lead and support Red Kite Alliance, Red Kite Teacher Training and Red Kite Teaching School Hub, serving a community of schools who work across all these strands. Rossett School is an active member of this community.

Red Kite Alliance is a partnership of over 50 schools working collaboratively to be 'stronger together'. Rossett School has representation in 19 subject networks that meet 3 times a year, as well as Headteacher briefings and Secondary Leaders meetings. In total there have been 58 in-person events and 64 online events with the Alliance in the past academic year.

Red Kite Teacher Training is one of the largest school centred initial teacher training providers in the country and Red Kite Teaching School Hub is one of 87 Teaching School Hubs nationally supporting teacher development.
